ORDINANCE NO. 46

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING HAWKING, PEDDLING AND VENDING WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITSOF THE TOWN OF CARLISLE

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in hawking, peddling or vending dry goods, groceries, notions, tinware, rubber goods, jewelry, watches, clocks, silver or plated wares, optical goods, spectacles, eye glasses, drugs, medicines, salves, cintments or other goods or merchandise of any description not herein mentioned without first procuring a license from the Recorder.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in peddling or selling dressed beef, pork, mutton, goat, kid or any kind of meat without first procuring a license from the Recorder, provided this shall not apply to any person selling his own products or productions.

SECTION 3. The license or privilege tax for hawking, peddling or vending within the corporate limits of the town of Carlisle, shall be \$5.00 per day or any part thereof. \$10.00 per week and \$25.00 per month.

SECTION 4. Any person violating sections one or two of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$25.00 for the first offense. For the second offense, not less than \$20.00 nor more than \$50.00.

SECTION 5. This ordinance repeals all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.
